Just a wee reminder that each week in October we have a different theme for collecting items. We are supporting Glasgow City Mission, East Dunbartonshire Food Banks, Glasgow Woman's Aid

The hall will be open each **Friday morning**, **11am-12noon**, where everyone can drop off specific items. We will work a one-way system, and won't be able to linger or chat, but please wear a face-covering.

Drop-off items are:

Friday 9th October: tins of soup, vegetables, fruit. Sweets, diluting juice.

Friday 16th October: packets, especially cereal, tea, coffee (decaf), sugar, pasta, instant mash, jam.

Friday 23rd October: toiletries and cleaning: bubble bath, gel, face masks, shampoo, and cleaning products for the home.

Friday 30th October: Children's items: writing and drawing materials, story books, crayons.
